On the Columban Missionaries Calendar for Oct 2020, there is a beautiful photo of a young couple and their child at a camp for internally displaced people attached to Momauk Parish in Bhamo, Myanmar. The young mother is feeding her baby and is smiling and radiant. The Daddy is sitting on a wooden stool at a simple homemade table using chopsticks to eat his food. It is a picture of poor people living in harmony and simplicity. I find it a reminder to live a simple life and not be distracted by the gloomy prognosis of the economy in these times. October is the month of the Rosary. We pray the Rosary after Mass every day. Wouldn't it be a great family exercise to pray the Rosary every evening at home, or even a decade. Wednesday 7th Oct is the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. One of my friends, Little Sister Annie, wrote –“The Rosary is part of the prayer of people who are poor. It would be a pity not to get used to thinking about the mysteries of Jesus' life, accompanied by Mary who lived so deeply the mystery of Nazareth, and was so closely associated with the Suffering Servant. We ought to be careful not to disregard or to give up too quickly, some of the popular devotions that have come out of the life and heart of poor people, and have found a place in God's own heart.”

On Friday we celebrate St. John Henry Newman. We will give Fr. Tom the day off to celebrate his great hero in the faith. - **Jim**
