In the month of October we celebrate the feasts of some famous men and women –Columba Marmion, St. Francis of Assisi, St Faustina, St. Bruno. St. John Henry Newman, St.Canice, St. John XX111, St. Teresa of Avila, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, St. Ignatius of Antioch, St. Luke, St. John Paul 11, Saints Simon and Jude. Great people of faith and hope. May they intercede for us to help us to continue to drink from the well of hope. Where do I find signs of hope in my everyday life? It is very important to keep looking.Here in Kilkenny, (Cill Chainnigh - the Church of Canice), we are grateful for that man of faith and hope who was born in Co. Derry and died in 603.
