Glory to God

- 1. Imagine my surprise when on Friday morning, I opened the readings for the Mass. It was from Kings 19: 1-14 describing Elijah's encounter with God. The very reading I chose for the Mass of Thanksgiving, weeks ago! Definitely there is a power at work in our lives which is surprising us.
- Sr. Helen Maher who read the reading once met me in Buea, Cameroon and in her surprise and amazement asked me the same question that God asked Elijah "What in the name of God, are you doing here, Jim Murphy?" I often ask myself that question. I am seeking the presence of the Lord.
