It was sunny and beautiful down in the mountains in the South of France. Waking up to the sunshine and a clear blue sky does wonders for one. However, there is a great drought going on in France and Spain. The farmers are crying out for rain. In the fields of maize there are huge sprinklers firing water in great jets out over the crops. Irrigation is necessary to save the crops. Some days it was so warm that it was not advisable to go out walking in the mountains. On those days we rose at 6am and walked a circuit before it got too warm. On one evening the thermostat in the yard reached 41'C. That is amazing heat and I settled for the shade. The coolest place in the village was the Church. I enjoyed sitting there in the silence and was appreciative of the opportunity to spend time or even 'waste' time switching off and just being in the Lord's presence. Silence is something we are not accustomed to in our busy lives. It is one of the beautiful features of mountain walking, just being away from it all.

An amazing experience was to see donkeys being milked on a farm. Curious, I enquired why they milked these animals. Seemingly asses' milk is an ingredient in the manufacture of cosmetics. Somebody told me that Queen Cleopatra used to bathe in asses' milk. I didn't know that. Anyway, I am delighted to have had a lovely break and I feel refreshed. Hopefully I will spend more time in the beautiful silence of the early mornings to pray and reflect on the Word, and to savour the sound of silence.- Fr. Jim
