# Winter Burglary Prevention – a message from the Gardaí

As we approach the time of year when the clocks are set to go back, we are once again appealing to people to secure their homes and premises and to Lock Up and Light Up during the winter months. Traditionally Burglaries increase by 20% over the winter months of October to March. Some simple methods can make your home and premises less vulnerable to Criminal Attack: Lighting around the house on a sensor or photocell, Lighting inside on timers, Natural Surveillance- trim shrubs down to 1m and trees up to 2m,Use Bogus Caller Cards, Close Curtains during hours of Darkness. **What Attracts the Burglar:**Signs of being unoccupied, Open Windows, Hidden keys, A buildup of Post /Milk, etc,No alarms, High vegetation. # Gift from the People of Ireland - Mission Sunday

When we consider the number of sisters and brothers, priests and lay women and men who have answered the call to spread the Gospel from Ireland, it is astonishing. What a wonderful example of generosity and enthusiasm. To visit St. Columban's in Navan or the St. Patrick's Missionaries in Kiltegan is always an inspiring experience. Whenever I go, I visit their cemeteries and pray a prayer of thanks for the priests who are laid to rest there. They were people who had generous hearts and who, having heard the call of the Gospel, felt it was important to share it to the different Continents. They were people of hope and love. In all my rambles visiting the fraternities of priests, I have met wonderful missionaries. One was a young Dublin lady sitting high up on a load of sacks of food on a lorry going up the Andes Mountains in Peru. A classmate, Fr Benny O'Shea was in Peru and he hired a mule so that I could accompany him and his mule visiting the little villages high up in the mountains. The views were spectacular, panoramas, and the welcome of the people for the priest on his yearly visit was amazing. We slept in sleeping bags on the floor of the school and in a corner was a hen hatching her chicks and in another corner, food packs with a memorable inscription - "gift from the people of Ireland." I never felt more proud in my life. I hope the hen didn't mind us cramping her style or invading her space! One phenomenon which is noticeable on all the missions is the spirit of hospitality and welcome. The Columbans welcomed six of us one evening at their house in Singalong in Manila as if we were members of their own Community, sharing all that they had. It is amazing too the efforts the missionaries make to learn the language of their people. An Irish Capuchin friar in South Korea was so fluent that he could tell jokes and yarns just like a native Korean.

The Holy Father, Francis, was a wonderful missionary. He was completely at ease visiting the people in the shanty towns around Buenos Aires in Argentina. Is it any wonder he has never lost the common touch and the love for people, especially the poorest. On this Mission Sunday, let us remember all the missionaries in our prayers. We give thanks for them and their generous service. The Holy Father, Francis, has a fund which is shared by these missionaries. He will be so appreciative of your generosity in turn, on this Mission Sunday. I'm sure he will smile when he sees "Gift from the People of Ireland." – **Fr Jim**
