## " October Coloured Weather"

"October Coloured weather" is here. In early October, the 4<sup>th</sup>, we celebrated the Feast Of St. Francis. I was delighted to have been invited to join our Capuchin friars for lunch. I met a young Polish friar who is studying English preparing to go on mission to South Sudan in the early New Year. Let us keep him, Augustino, and the other friars in our prayers. They have a simple way of life and they live in a beautiful cheerful spirit. On Thursday last we celebrated the feast of St. Bruno, the founder of the Carthusians. He

was a professor of theology in Reims, France and he founded the monastery Grande Chartreuse in the French Alps, north of Grenoble. They live as hermits and come together in community for prayer and a meal, and a four hour walk every week. A fascinating film was made in 2005 on the life of the Carthusians. – Into Great Silence – which can be seen on Netflix and on YouTube. It is reassuring to know these holy men are praying for the world by day and by night.

One of my heroes is Pope John XX111 whose feast day is coming up next week on Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> October. He was the fourth of 13 children born to poor parents on a small farm near Bergamo in the north of Italy. At the age of 76 he was elected Pope in 1958. I remember clearly the pictures of his smiling face on the newspapers. They called him Good Pope John. He never lost his simple touch, his fondness for people and his devotion to and openness to the Holy Spirit. He called the Second Vatican Council – all the bishops of the world were summoned to reflect on the Church's Mission to the modem world. The Council convened on 11<sup>th</sup> October, 1962. Pope John died the following year. Good Pope John was canonized by Pope Francis on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2014.

Finally, also on 11<sup>th</sup> October we celebrate the feast of St. Canice after whom our city is named – the Church of St. Canice – Cill Chainnigh. May these great and holy men continue to inspire us and pray for us, that we may open our hearts and minds to the Holy Spirit and be cheerful followers of Jesus.– **Fr Jim**
