Advent

These November mornings are dark. When the alarm goes off it is a summons to rise from the warmth of the bed to face the new day and it is still dark. It is not easy. Is it any wonder so many of our animal friends hibernate and stay warm in their beds until Springtime comes around.

"When the light fades we no longer see things clearly." Pope John Paul 11.

We are encouraged by this Sunday's gospel to "Stay Awake" ...stand ready. I remember staying awake watching a sow having bonhams, warm and cosy in the heat of an infra-red lamp chatting with my mother. It is not easy to stay awake. During these weeks of Advent let us stay awake by trying to be attentive and receptive to the gift God is offering. God promised to send His Son. When he came most people failed to appreciate him and the gift he brought into a divided and wounded world.

In the season of Advent we are invited to learn how to wait and to focus our minds on the joy of God's gift of a Saviour. It is a special time, a time for silence and prayer, a time to appreciate God's gifts in our lives – we need to be alert and attuned to recognise them. It is so easy to be swept up in the commercial advertising and the stocking of food and drink. Advent will help us to keep our focus, live simply and let our faith grow in the times of silence and prayer.

One of my classmates, Eamon Tobin, died this year. It was a sudden death and we were shocked and taken aback. Fr Eamon ministered all his life in Florida, in the U.S.

A colleague sent me this beautiful prayer he wrote and I am so happy to share it with you. It will be a beautiful way of praying each day during Advent. Please have a look at the Advent poster in Church to find resources to help you prepare for Christmas – **Fr Jim**

Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I come into your loving presence with gratitude for another day. I thank you for the blessings in life that I tend to take for granted: food, shelter, health, family, work, and faith in you. May I live this day in a manner that pleases you, and helps me to become the person You created me to be.

Help me to recognise and respond generously to the promptings of the Holy Spirit in the events and encounters of this day. May I live this day with the dispositions of heart that reflect the values of Jesus: love, truth, compassion, mercy, justice and kindness.

When decisions need to be made, help me to choose well. When asked to walk the extra mile, grant me generosity of heart.

Protect me from the false ways of the Evil One and help me to live in your Truth. Expand my capacity for love and joy. In all things, may I give you honour and glory.
