#### Synod Update

As the Synod in Rome continues in these weeks the 400 members are gathering in the Paul VI hall at the rear of St Peter's Basilica. The format of this Synod is noticeably different from the many that have gone before. All gathered are seated at round tables and all, irrespective of "role", are given the same time to speak. Pope Francis has worked to ensure that all gathered can speak freely but also that they truly make listening a priority. He has noted that at this gathering the Holy Spirit is not merely present but should be seen as the "protagonist" guiding the discussions. To create this atmosphere, Pope Francis has requested confidentiality on the part of Synod members, and in this sense a "fasting from public speech". It is working - we had intended to write to inform you what was happening each week but, thankfully, we do not know.. or at least we do not know the detail of what is being said - Synod members are respecting this freedom to talk and listen with fear of being quoted. # Brother James's big beads

When we were young lads serving Mass in the Capuchin Friary years ago (!!) there was an old friar called Brother James. He worked as the Sacristan, getting the altar ready and looking after the church. Once a year there was a Forty Hours Adoration – the Blessed Sacrament was exposed and there were a hundred candles lighting on the altar. Poor James had a big job trying to replace burnt out candles and making sure he didn't set fire to the place. He was such a gentle, kind and humble person. Hanging from the white cord on his habit was a very large Rosary beads. Boy, did he make use of it! You would see him kneeling at a priedieu in a dark corner of the Sacristy fingering his beads.

October is the month of the Rosary and we could follow Bro. James's example by reciting at least a decade every day.

We continue to welcome in a particular way those children who are preparing to celebrate the sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion for the first time next year. Our focus this month is on helping them to understand the Rosary as a special prayer said by the parish family, in which we recall events in the life of Jesus and his mother, Mary. We can all make a special effort to say the Rosary, or part of it, during the month of October. - **Fr Jim**
