Synod Update

This past week, as the current phase of the Synod comes to a close, delegates approved a two-page letter "to the people of God" by applauding. Synod members had voted last week overwhelmingly (355-11) in favour of publishing a letter to tell us, the rest of the Church not in attendance, what they have been discussing in these past four weeks. It is good that they are keeping us informed - synod by its very nature is about communication - listening and responding. In reading this letter we will listen and then we will get to respond. Bishop Niall will lead us in our discussions of this document in Ossory. In advance of reading it, it is good to remember that this phase of the synod is about deliberations; that is to say decisions won't be made but certainly issues will be moved along and that is most welcome. After all we are, in this synod, merely listening to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. - **Fr. Dermot Ryan**
