Synod Update

This past week saw the much awaited Synodal gathering start in Rome. Normally reserved to the bishops this synod, at the request of Pope Francis, invited lay faithful, priests and religious from around the world to come together to discern the promptings of the Holy Spirit for the Church today. This is a continuance of the synodal gatherings we had in Ossory and in every Diocese throughout the world. Our ideas are carried there by the Irish delegation. With such a variety of voices from every part of the world it was recognised that at this synod tensions will exist - as each one tries to make their views heard. The Dominican priest Fr Timothy Radcliffe has preached to all gathered in these opening days - he noted, in one of these addresses, that in English we say that "we fall in love but we make friends" reminding those gathered for the synod that difference is ok, variance is to be welcomed and that we won't fall into agreement, we will have to work to make it happen. We pray for the Synod as the first week concludes, may they make harmony happen. – **Fr. Dermot Ryan**

October - Mission Month

You will notice a poster in the Church porch, a picture of three beautiful children from Calcutta, reminding us of the Missions. We celebrate World Mission Sunday on the 22nd October. This year Pope Francis has chosen a theme inspired by the story of the disciples on the way to Emmaus in the Gospel of Luke (cf. 24:13-35) "Hearts on Fire, Feet on the Move." The two disciples were confused and dismayed after the death of their Master, Jesus. They met Christ on the road and they eventually recognized him. This encounter with him sparked in them an enthusiastic desire to set out again towards Jerusalem and proclaim that the Lord had truly risen. Their hearts burned within them as they heard the Scriptures explained by Jesus, their eyes were opened as they recognized him and, ultimately, their feet set out on the way. During October we will try to focus on the great work the missionaries are doing in our world. In our prayer we pray that they will have the strength and enthusiasm to support the poor of our world. Some 1,100 of the world's 2500 dioceses in Africa, Asia and Latin America are poor, some even in distress.

Our contributions on Mission Sunday make it possible for Pope Francis to aid projects in some of the poorest countries of our world. Thank you. Every little helps.
