Pope Leo XIV Releases Dilexi Te: A Call to Love the Poor

On October 9, 2025, Pope Leo XIV released his first major document as pope, titled *Dilexi Te*, which means "I Have Loved You." Drawing on the reflections of Pope Francis who began work on the document and on Scripture and the experiences of marginalised communities, Pope Leo speaks directly to Christians and all people of goodwill, encouraging a renewed commitment to justice, compassion, and human dignity.

In *Dilexi Te*, Pope Leo points out that caring for the poor is not just charity, but a central part of what it means to follow Christ. He warns against the document e dangers of economic systems that allow the rich to thrive while many others suffer. In strong language, he criticizes what he calls the "dictatorship of an economy that kills," urging leaders and individuals alike to confront the growing gap between wealth and poverty.

The pope presents the poor not just as recipients of help, but as teachers of the faith. Their lives, he says, reflect Christ's own humility and dependence on God, and they show us what it means to trust and to persevere. He also devotes attention to migrants and refugees, calling them a "living sign" of Christ's call to welcome the stranger and to practice hospitality in a world that often rejects them.

Pope Leo insists that faith must go beyond prayer it must also lead to action. He encourages Christians to fight for structural changes in society that promote dignity, access to jobs, housing, education, and equal opportunity. While personal charity is important, he stresses that long lasting change requires transforming unjust systems. You can read the document in full on the Vatican website www.vatican.va
