Advent -week 2

What a beautiful season- Advent. It gives us an opportunity to prepare for the celebration of Christmas. Last Sunday as the organist, Sean O'Neill struck up the hymn "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" and I got ready to sing, I felt the great hope and expectation which is found in those words. I'm delighted that there was a very favourable reaction to the music at Mass. It looks very much like this continuing for Advent and for Christmas too. In these times, the safest place for you to be is at home.

You may follow Mass on radio or webcam and I earnestly advise you to continue to do so. For the celebration of Christmas, there are 12 days. It is such an important feast –the coming of the Saviour. You might think about attending on any of the Twelve days of Christmas. For the Christmas Eve Masses, you might please remain in your cars in the car park, turn on radio 108fm and come out to receive Communion at the main door of the Church. Hardy younger folk might be happy to put on heavy clothing and weather permitting, attend Mass outside. The outdoor speaker has been repaired and we hope you hear us very clearly.

My bottom line is –stay safe. This is a deadly disease. No room for complacency. The safest place for you to pray at Christmas is at home.

We hope to celebrate Christmas Eve at 7pm and 9pm, On Christmas Day at 9.30am and 11.30am. During the Octave of Christmas, daily Mass will be at 10am.
