A Modern Day Teenage 'Saint'

Perhaps you noticed that a teenager was beatified last October.

His name was Carlo Acutis. He spent the first eight years of his short life (1991 - 2006) in London before emigrating to Italy with his Italian parents. His parents were non-practising Catholics. When Carlo made his First Communion, he decided to go to Mass every Sunday. The truth of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Eucharist really struck him. At a young age he was also a computer geek. He taught himself how to programme and went on to create websites cataloguing the world's Eucharistic Miracles and Marian apparitions. He's been nicknamed the 'Patron Saint of the Internet.' At the same time Carlo was a normal boy who liked to make his classmates and teachers laugh. He loved soccer, video games, and had a sweet tooth. Instead of buying a video game he really wanted, he used his first savings to buy a sleeping bag for a homeless man he often saw on his way to Mass. Carlo grew up in a very well-off family. There were cooks and staff in the house. He helped the cleaning staff by setting his alarm clock some minutes early in order to tidy the room, make the bed and so lessen the work of the staff. One of these was a Hindu: he was so touched by Carlo's practical goodness that he decided to become a Catholic. Carlo's true passion was the Eucharist which he called 'his highway to heaven.' He began to investigate Eucharistic Miracles. He used all his computer talents to create a website that traced that history. Here are some notes he wrote in his diary. 'Don't be afraid: with the Incarnation of Jesus, death becomes life. In eternal life, something extraordinary awaits us.' 'All people are born as originals but many die as photocopies.' 'Sadness is looking at ourselves, happiness is looking towards God.' 'Our souls are like a hot air balloon...Confession is like the fire underneath the balloon enabling the soul to rise again.' The next World Youth Day will be in Lisbon when more than a million young people are likely to assemble. Expect to see Carlo as a Patron of that great occasion - Fr.Tom
