Holy Week 2021

Little did we think that we would still be in lockdown and have to celebrate Holy Week virtually again this year.

Holy Week is the most sacred and important week in the lives of Christians. May I invite you to enter into the spirit of Holy Week by taking time to pray and appreciate the goodness and grandeur of God in the life of Jesus.

A few years ago, I had the joy of seeing the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels, in downtown Los Angeles. The artist John Nava has crafted an amazing series of 37 tapestries which hang and adorn the walls of the Cathedral. You may view them on a documentary film called "Divining the Human" He has taken the people he has met as subjects for his artistic pieces. So Mary Magdalen and the Saints are members of the parish. It is beautiful. I am reminded of this as I reflect on Holy Week. We could fall into the danger of taking this whole experience of Jesus for granted because of being too familiar with the story. May I suggest that you place yourself and those you love into the scenes. We all have had experience of pain and rejection, confusion and uncertainty. Things must have appeared hopeless for Jesus. He was abandoned and alone, almost losing faith in God and humans. Think of the lovely people he met - the lady who wiped his face and comforted him – Veronica, Simon who lifted the cross to share his burden, His mother, Mary who was heartbroken, the thief who was sympathetic towards him.

Let us remember the caring people we have met in our times of pain or difficulty. No matter how hopeless or bleak our situation may appear, let us open our hearts to the loving God and Father who was faithful to Jesus and who crowned him with new life. The Stations of the Cross will give you an opportunity to journey along the painful way with Jesus as we reflect on our lives in these painful times of lockdown and covid.- Fr Jim
