During the week I read a great story about FEAR. It is thousands of years old, about a man condemned to spend a night in a cell with a poisonous snake. He realized that any movements or noise and the snake would be on top of him and it spelled certain death. He stood all night in the corner opposite where the snake was, and he was scared. With the coming of dawn light he began to make out the shape of the snake, and he was saying to himself, "wasn't I lucky that I didn't stir." But when the full force of light came in, he noticed that it wasn't a snake at all. It was an old rope.

"The story is banal but the word of the story is profound: In a lot of the rooms of our minds, there are harmless old ropes thrown in corners but when our fear begins to work on them, we convert them into monsters who hold us prisoners in the bleakest, most impoverished rooms of our heart.
