#### **St Patrick**

Imagine having had a comfortable upbringing and to have been captured and sold as a slave – with no rights and no protection. He was lost, without friend or future. It is hard to imagine the impact of such a traumatic experience on one so young. Yet, as he wrote his Confession in his old age, he recognized the great gifts that came to him during this painful and lonely time of exile. Although he was baptized, he acknowledged that as an adolescent, he had turned away from God. However, in exile while herding sheep in all kinds of weather, he had the most extraordinary spiritual awakening. Patrick's life teaches us to be attentive to the ways the Lord may be surprisingly present in situations of great struggle that seem devoid of any value at the time. This awareness of the Love of God came to Patrick in the course of his life. The same experience was that of Charles de Foucauld, the hermit in the Sahara who will be canonized by Pope Francis on 15<sup>th</sup> May. May St. Patrick give us courage and faith to try our best to live as the Lord's disciples in these trying and difficult days. May he intercede for us and bless us with peace. - **Fr Jim**
