When he put everything on the tray, the mug, teapot, milk and a bun, he said "would you like me to take your tray over to the table?" Maybe I was looking a wreck after the long journey and he had a care for my wellbeing. I thanked him, forgave him for not scalding the teapot and went to enjoy his act of humble service which might otherwise have gone unnoticed. Every day has golden moments. Be on the lookout for them.
