Our New Bishop

Born on 25 August 1963 in Letterkenny, Co Donegal, Bishop-elect Coll was ordained a priest on 3 July 1988 for the Diocese of Raphoe, which covers most of Donegal. Over this time, he has taught at second level in Donegal, has lectured in Saint Patrick's College Carlow and has served as Professor of Religious Studies and Religious Education, Saint Mary's University College, Belfast. In 2019 he returned to the Diocese and his most recent appointment has been as parish priest of Donegal and Clar.

Bishop-elect Coll's ministry has also included conducting retreats for clergy, and he has contributed to various publications, including *Doctrine and Life, The Furrow, The Irish Theological Quarterly* and *The Tablet.* In addition, he was the Editorial Director of the Catholic School ethos journal *Le Chéile.*

At Sunday's Ordination Mass, the Chief Ordaining Prelate will be Archbishop Dermot Farrell, Archbishop of Dublin, who will be assisted by Co-Consecrators Bishop Denis Nulty, Bishop of Kildare & Leighlin and outgoing Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Ossory, and by Bishop Alan McGuckian SJ, Bishop of Raphoe.
